TMH (1868) Cerussite; malachite; erinite [cornwallite].

BM: Malachite

QEL (1858) Malachite, fibrous & radiated, with cerussite.
Two specimens of erinite [cornwallite] exist, one in the
Geog Coll. Said to have come from Co Limerick,
but probably Cornish, because resemble
Cornish cornwallite, & assoc with small xls of
olivine & aphanosite [clinoclase].

Weaver (Tr. G.S. Lond (1838), Ser 2, 5, 1) records
a 3-4 ft calcite vein "recently discovered", with
"antimonial galena; earthy carbonate of lead
and oxide of antimony; grey copper ore;
antimonial copper ore (ie tetrahedrite);
blue & green carbonates of copper; & blende"

Lode & mine not found by Geol Surv (see Memoir
143, (1860)); MS 6" map records "seems to be the
shaft of an old mine".

BALLYSTEEN MINE, Ballycananna, Limerick, IrelandTMM (1868) Carb. Lim. galena; melaconite.GeL (1858) "Ballystein" - melaconite } = tenoriteCole (1922) 123 (Pb) Ballysteen (Ballystein) mine, near Ballysteen House. Mem G.S. (1860) 143 says on a rich pocket of argentiferous galena in EW lode, Weaver, Trans G.S. London (1838) Ser 2, 5, 1, says abandoned by 1836; one 17-fm shaft & shallow workings. "Silver Mine" on 6" map.

(E. Farley, Priv Comm to GR) Gages, J. Geol. Soc
Dub. 1860 descr & anal a variscite
from Loghill - old spec. in NMI, part →
GR. with quartz; light-green transluc.
masses & veins to 3 mm w small drusy cav.
XRD, microprob, GR's IR = Lucin-type variscite.
Described as from WHITE RIVER ~ 4 ml
S of Loghill: presum. an erratic.

MAHONAGH, Newcastle West, Limerick, Ireland.

TMH (1868) "Newcastle". Galena.

Cole (1922) 124 (Pb). Stewart, Trans Dub Soc 1 pt 2 (1800)
speaks of "former great works" at bottom of
14 ft shaft at Mahonagh [ie MAHOONAGH, SE
of Newcastle]. Small rich vein of Pb ore. Date
unknown.

MAYNE, Limerick, Ireland

Cole (1922), 124 (Pb). Stewart (Trans Dub Soc. 1 pt 2 (1800))
records several small spits in Main or Mayne townland,
on Pb veins. Nothing on 6" geol map.

NEWCASTLE WEST, Limerick, Ireland.

N-F (1959) 12: A few miles S of SILVERMINES [q.v.]. $\frac{2}{3}$ ml
EW fault, with sparse surface mineralisation
of the copper-lead-zinc-barite assemblage

Cole (1922) 39, 124 (Pb) Mem Geol Surv (1861) 154. describes
lode fully. Runs E-W, ca $\frac{1}{2}$ ml NE of
Oola railway stn. Several shafts; by
1859 workings confined to W end.
chalcopyrite raised, as well as argentiferous
galena; barite gangue.

PALLASKENRY MINE, Ballydoole N, Limerick, Ireland.

Cole (1922), 37 (Cu). M. Geol. S. (1860), 143. records
tetrahedrite & bornite in fragments of
quartz gangue. Seems to have closed
 soon after sinking (ca 1856). ~~The~~ Kinahan (1889)
 implies that some Pb ore got.

An older mine was found when sinking
 a pump-hole at Old Charter School-house,
 a little to the NW.

RATHJORDAN, Limerick, Ireland.

Prior, MM 15 315 (1910) Leucite (altered into analcime)
in analcime - basalt.
